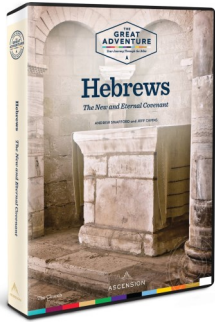
Father Gilbaugh on a podcast!

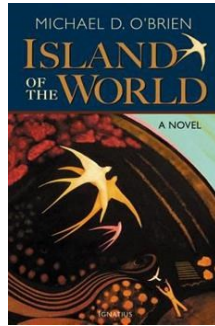
