What Did Father Read on Retreat?

The Spirit of the Liturgy, by Romano Guardini

Pope Benedict XVI honored Guardini by naming his book on the liturgy with the same title. Guardini wrote this classic of liturgical theology back in the 1920's, in which he considers the Roman Rite's style, seriousness, fellowship, symbolism, etc. Not really a profound piece of theology by current standards, this book is important more for the impact it had in the early 20th century liturgical movement, and could certainly be skipped by anyone not studying liturgy specifically.

Render Unto Caesar, by Charles Chaput

In this very readable book from 2008, Archbishop Chaput (a friend from Denver seminary days) unpacks the history of the Catholic Church in the United States, as regards Catholic involvement in the public square and political life. The author reveals quite a number of interesting titbits of history that might not be known to most people, and concludes with his thesis that unless Catholics apply their faith when voting and serving in public office, our society will only continue to suffer from recent negative trends.

The Porn Myth, by Matt Fradd

In this recent publication, a faithful Catholic husband and father exposes the science, statistics, and ugly reality behind a modern-day epidemic. He does this by deconstructing a series of 'myths' around pornography, its effects, and its industry. Right away he makes clear that this is not a religious book, although he is a religious person - rather, it is a science-based attempt by a Catholic to challenge the common idea that porn is 'no big deal'. Fradd does a good job of balancing delicacy with the unfortunate need to be specific with certain disturbing facts (hence, this is only recommended for adults), and this book should arguably be read by all parents who have children at home, since childhood and adolescence are often where pornography enters into people's lives.
