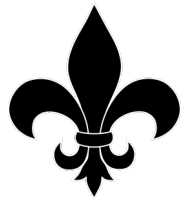

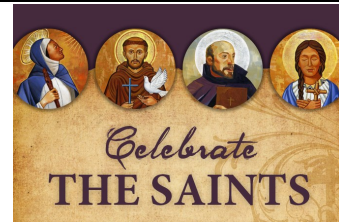

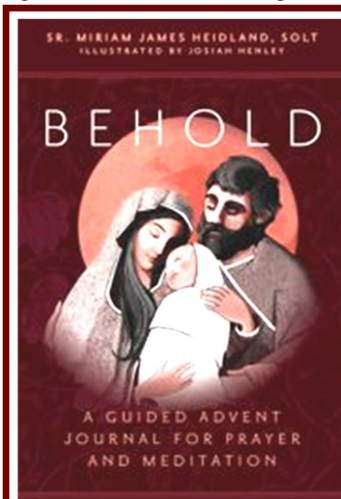


Sacred Music for Advent & Christmas

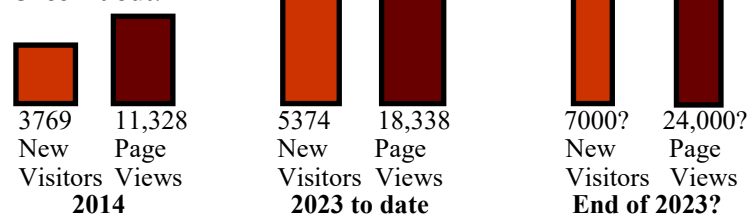
Parish Updates & Tidbits

THE NATIONAL SHRINE OF OUR LADY OF CHAMPION

There is just one church-approved Marian apparition site in the United States, and it is in the little town of Champion, Wisconsin (not far from Green Bay). Recently having received approval from the Vatican, Our Lady of Good Help's title has been changed to Our Lady of Champion. Learn about Our Lady's visits to Adele Brice in 1859, Adele's mission, and the miracle attributed to the site during the Great Peshtigo Fire of 1871 at championshrine.org. Along with other events at the shrine over the weekend, the First Solemnity Mass will take place Monday, October 9th and will be livestreamed on the shrine's website as well as Facebook page. The Mass will also be broadcast on Relevant Radio (KOFK in Bozeman, 88.1 FM) as well as on the Relevant Radio app.
